ROLEX FEI WORLD CUP™ JUMPING FINAL

Riders qualified for the Rolex FEI World Cup™ Final according to the Rolex FEI World Cup™ Jumping Rules Article 657, plus extra riders for the 1 training session and Competition No. 3. Riders qualified for the Rolex FEI World Cup™ Final may bring 2 qualified FEI World Cup™ horses. Additional foreign riders invited for Competition No. 3 (Las Vegas Grand Prix) may bring 1 horse. All riders receive their invitations through their National Federations. 375.00 USD Entry Fee.

JUMPING GRAND PRIX OF LAS VEGAS

Qualification: Invitations to the Grand Prix of Las Vegas are based on the Rolex FEI World Cup™ North American 2008/09 standings. All riders who have accumulated 25 or more Rolex FEI World Cup™ points are eligible to participate. Each rider may bring one horse. Competitors may compete in the Wednesday training session as well as the Grand Prix. The Horse inspections on Tuesday are required for all horses competing in the Jumping Grand Prix of Las Vegas.

Nominations: Riders should declare their intent to participate by calling the Organizing Committee, care of Stephanie Wheeler, (949) 443-1841, no later than April 1, 2009. Entry forms can be faxed to (949) 443-1843.

Fees: Competitors invited specifically for the Grand Prix of Las Vegas are responsible for paying and arranging transportation, lodging and any other expenses for themselves and any others in their party, and also the transportation costs of their horse. The stall fee is \$250 and entry fee for the class is \$375. Bedding and feed will be available for sale. All fees should be made payable to **Las Vegas Events** and will be due upon check-in.

ROLEX FEI WORLD CUP™ DRESSAGE FINAL

Riders qualified for the Rolex FEI World Cup™ Dressage Final according to Rules for the FEI World Cup™ for Dressage Riders Articles 484 - 486.

1. Transport of horses, grooms and riders from Europe.

The Organizing Committee is responsible for the costs of a charter aircraft from Europe to Las Vegas and return transport for the European based horses (one horse per rider). The departure will be from Liège Airport (Belgium), on a Federal Express aircraft on Saturday the 11th April returning to Liège on Monday the 20th April. Exact flight schedules will be advised shortly. The OC has appointed Peden Bloodstock (Peden) to coordinate the charter flights, the formalities at Liège airport and in Europe. The Organizing Committee is responsible for the costs of transporting (economy class accommodations) the European riders (Western and Central) and extra riders qualified through the FEI World Cup™ Western European League and Central European League - and their grooms. The riders will arrive on commercial aircraft on Sunday 12 or Monday 13 April prior to competition. The Organizing Committee will provide riders and grooms with an airfare allowance for commercial travel, leaving the actual flight itinerary planning to the riders, respectively. This allowance will be established by the Organizing Committee four weeks prior to the ROLEX FEI WORLD CUP™ FINALS by taking the price of an economy class ticket from Frankfurt (GER) to Las Vegas (USA). Riders and Grooms must provide a copy of the airline ticket to receive reimbursement. The grooms will be transported via the charter flight or via commercial flights as weight restrictions limit the number of grooms on the charter flight to 1 groom per 2 horses. **N.B. Each rider is limited to 150 kg of tack and equipment – there is no exception to this rule – riders may not pay for additional weight – it will not be loaded on the charter.** All grooms must comply with airline rules and regulations. Anyone violating these rules and regulations will not be allowed on the FEI World Cup™ return Charter. Smoking is strictly prohibited. Riders/NFs need to contact Peden Bloodstock for further information and to arrange for the blood being tested.

2. Transport of horses, grooms and riders from the United States.

The United States Equestrian Federation will be responsible for the horse transportation expense for all qualified FEI World Cup™ horses representing the United States. The Organizing Committee will be responsible for the transportation expenses for all qualified FEI World Cup™ riders and grooms. 3. Transport of horses, grooms and riders from Canada.

The Organizing Committee will be responsible for the transportation costs of the Canadian entries (2) – rider with one horse and groom per rider - from a selected airport/place in either Canada or Florida. The Organizing Committee will determine a horse transportation allowance based on a quote from the official horse transport company representing the OC. The re-inspection of horses by the Ground Jury and the Veterinary Commission will take place on 15 April 2009 at a time to be determined.

The second horse inspection for Jumping horses qualified for the Final Rolex FEI World Cup™ competition will take place on Sunday at a time to be determined.

All horses taking part at this event must be presented during the first horse inspection, otherwise they are not permitted to participate.

3. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

1. All horses arriving on the official flight from Europe will be granted waivers for Piro-Plasmosis and C.E.M. (Contagious Equine Metritis) however, these horses must have valid negative tests for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA), Dourine and Glanders completed within 30 days of transport. Pre-testing of horses will take place in Europe. Samples for these horses must be submitted to meet pre-testing requirements.
2. All horses on the official flight from Europe will be quarantined in a special facility until entry requirements are satisfied. During this time (approximately 48 hours), only one (1) attendant per horse (either groom or rider, but not both) will be allowed entry into quarantine barn to care for and hand-walk horses. Quarantine hours will be limited and posted.
3. Anyone entering the quarantine barn during this time must don protective outer-ware and foot protectors, which will be kept inside the facility.
4. No horse may go outside the quarantine barn and waste material will remain in quarantine until entry requirements are met.
5. Grooms and riders who have entered the quarantine barn prior to entry requirements being satisfied may not enter the non-quarantine barn area or have contact with any horses outside the quarantine barn for five (5) days after arrival.
6. After entry requirements are satisfied, entry to the quarantine barn will be limited to persons with proper credentials.
7. Horses from CEM infected countries will be monitored to avoid contact with other horses. Separate exercise schedule will be posted.
8. All other horses not arriving on the European charter must comply with the official U.S.D.A. regulations for horses entering the USA from foreign countries.

*All horses participating in the Rolex FEI World Cup™ Finals and being transported on the official flight from Europe must be tested prior to departure (approx 14 days) and show negative results for EIA (coggins), dourine, glanders and piroplasmosis. We will obtain from USDA a waiver for piroplasmosis for all horses but we still need to know if any of the horses competing are positive. We will also obtain a CEM waiver for all mares and stallions. If as in the 2007 FEI World Cup™ any of the mares and stallions wish to remain in the U.S. after the show they must have negative results on all 4 tests and have at least one CEM swab prior to arrival into Las Vegas. They will be tested again for all 4 tests prior to the competition and must again show negative results otherwise they will have to return to Europe with the charter. They will then after the show ends will continue onto a CEM facility to go ahead and fulfil the USDA requirements to stay in the U.S.

4. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective 1 January 2009 will apply:

Art. 139.1

NFs must keep a register of the Owners and lessees of Horses with official passports. Changes of Owners and records of Leasing Agreements must be entered in the FEI and/or National Passport and authenticated by the stamp and signature of an official of the NF.

Art. 139.2

The nationality of a Horse is that of its Owner or of the lessee, where a lease is current, or of the country in which the company owning or leasing it is registered. A company may, however, own a Horse in partnership with an individual, see paragraph 3.

Art. 139.3

When one or more Horses belong to a partnership of Owners of different nationalities, the Owners must declare to the FEI, before making the first entry, the nationality under which the Horse or Horses will compete and that nationality must be entered in the FEI and/or National passport. The Horses must retain that nationality until the partnership is dissolved or the Horses are sold. Any consequent change of nationality must be reported to the FEI.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. APPENDIX VI

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex III)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*,4*,5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. In CICs3*/4*, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is

recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016). Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and **Athletes** must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

DECLARATION OF FEI WORLD CUP™ JUMPING HORSES

FEI World Cup™ horses (max. 2) must be declared by the rider by at least 30 minutes after the end of the last training session on 18th April. Only declared horses that meet the requirements in Article 657.11 may compete in the three Rolex FEI World Cup™ Final competitions. Horses must be declared on the form issued by the Organising Committee. The form must be signed by the rider.

DECLARATION FOR FIRST AND SECOND FINAL FEI WORLD CUP™ JUMPING COMPETITIONS

The declaration for the 1st Final competition (competition 1) must be made by at least 30 minutes after the last training session at the same time as the nomination of the FEI World Cup™ horses. The declaration for the 2nd Final competition (competition 2) must be made within 30 minutes following the end of the 1st Final competition (competition 1).

DECLARATION FOR THIRD FINAL FEI WORLD CUP™ JUMPING COMPETITION (competition 4)

The horse to compete in the 3rd Final Competition of the FEI World Cup™ must be entered by at least 30 minutes after the end of the 2nd Final Competition (competition 2).

At the same time the declaration must be made. Both the entry and declaration must be made on the form issued by the Organising Committee and must be duly signed by the rider.

FEI World Cup™ Point System Art. 659.3

In the first two Final competitions points are given to all competitors having finished the initial round. The winner of both competitions gets one point more than the number of starters in the first final competition. The second placed gets two points less than the winner, the third placed three points less than the winner, and so on.

Competitors who have been eliminated or have retired in the initial round do not get points. Points won by competitors who are tied are added up and divided equally. Fractions of 0,5 and more are rounded up; fractions of less than 0,5 are rounded down.

After the second Final competition, FEI World Cup™ points are transformed into penalties. The competitor with the highest number of World Cup points after two competitions will have 0 penalties. For all other competitors the number of penalties will be calculated by multiplying with the coefficient of 0.50 the difference between their number of FEI World Cup™ points and the FEI World Cup™ points of the leading competitor after two competitions. In this procedure all decimals are rounded down.

IMPORTANT

The value of the **1st prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money** distributed for the competition. The minimum number of prizes offered for each competition must be allocated on the basis of one prize for every commenced four Athletes, with a minimum of five prizes. **The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed.** (GR Art 127, 128)

The retail value of all prizes in kind must be mentioned as well as detail of model, type and special features for cars.

Instructions for breakdown of prize money:

- **No more than 1/3 of the total prize money for the competition to the winner.**
- **Break down for 1st to 8th place (at least) in a reasonable descending order of distribution must be listed in the Schedule.**
- **The minimum amount the last placed competitor receives must be indicated in the Schedule.**
- **Minimum 25% of competitors must receive prize money (one prize for every four starters), however minimum 5 prizes if there are 20 or fewer athletes taking part in the competition.**
- **The FEI has the right to alter the amounts proposed for distribution if the necessity arises.**
